Here is the latest update from the Henley Neighbourhood Policing team. Henley Sector comprises of Henley Town and the parishes of Goring, Woodcote, Goring Heath, South Stoke, Whitchurch-on-Thames, Nettlebed, Swyncombe, Pishill with Stonor, Bix & Assendon, Stoke Row, Highmoor, Checkendon, Rotherfield Greys, Sonning Common, Rotherfield Peppard, Kidmore End, Mapledurham, Harpsden, Binfield Heath, Shiplake, Eye & Dunsden.

You said we did

You said you wanted to see us more

We are spending as much time as possible patrolling high footfall areas such as the town centre and retail outlets. The aim being to engage with business owners and the public, reassuring them we are present, deterring those who might want to offend on our area.

High visibility patrols continue around the Skate Park in Sonning Common and PCSO Smith & Bell continue to carry out high visibility patrols in the rural areas to deter and disrupt rural crime.

You said you were concerned about Burglaries in the area

<u>Crime</u>

- A van was seized and one male detained for entering a private yard in the Nuffield area; the investigation is ongoing at this time.
- A truck was stolen and three containers broken into on an industrial estate in Sonning Common on 18th April. Again this investigation is ongoing
- Incident of tools taken from a van parked outside a property in Goring; enquiries ongoing.

Theft from vehicles

We have had a few thefts from vehicles in the area recently, two of which were on the Gainsborough estate where power tools were taken out of vans. Please remain vigilant and report any suspicious vehicles or people. Try and take all items out of you vehicles at night and use locks and alarms. Park in well-lit areas and on drive ways and in garages where possible.

Anti-social behaviour (ASB)

We are continuing our patrols at peak times around Sonning Common where ASB remains an issue. We have broken the ASB down into different elements for problem solving. High visibility patrols around the youth club and skate-park are taking place in order to deter and engage with offenders.

Arrest for vehicle crime

A young male was arrested for a series of incidents on Thursday 12th April in the Sonning Common and Kingswood area. Offences included taking a vehicle, theft from a vehicle and criminal damage. Crime Reduction

Door to Door Selling: During the week beginning Sunday 8th April Police received numerous phone calls from the public and emails from Neighbourhood Watch regarding nuisance door to door salesmen, commonly referred to as "Nottingham Knockers". The males sell various domestic items at highly inflated prices. We are told by the public that they are often intimidated by these males and feel

obligated to make a purchase. Due to the many calls from the public the PCSOs were able to identify the vehicle and some of the males involved. The neighbourhood team will continue to monitor and investigate this situation over the summer.

We advise the public to continue contacting us and look out for vulnerable neighbours who might be persuaded to make unnecessary purchases.

Scam Phone Calls: PCSO Bell visited and reassured an elderly female in Goring Heath, after receiving a scam phone call. PCSO Smith visited and reassured two vulnerable people in Catslip after receiving calls claiming to be from HMRC and insisting the aggrieved call a telephone number to avoid serious consequences.

We advise recipients not to engage, give any information and not to call the number given. Continue to call police.
