**GENERAL OCC REPORT**

**GENERAL ELECTION IN OXFORDSHIRE**

Subsequent to the general election, the Oxfordshire seats of Banbury, Henley, Oxford West & Abingdon, Wantage and Witney all remain Conservative while Oxford East was held by the Labour Party. The Conservative Manifesto outlines a number of policies that will have implications for services run by the County Council, and we will get details as soon as they are available.

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**LOCAL ELECTIONS**

A by-election also took place for the County Council in West Witney & Bampton and was won by James Mills for the Conservatives. The Conservative Independent Alliance retains control of the County Council.

**OCC WINS £12.9M FOR HIGHWAY DRAINAGE & STREET-LIGHTING IMPROVEMENTS**

OCC has been successful in bidding for £12.9m of Government money to improve street lighting, road drainage and carriageway condition in the county. The Council is one of 31 across the country to receive grant funding from the Department for Transport's £275m Challenge Fund – which was set up for councils to bid for one-off major infrastructure schemes. As part of the bidding process the council had to guarantee £1.6m of funding from its own budgets – taking the total spending to £14.5m. Some of the money will be spent on reviewing and replacing Oxfordshire's older street-lighting between 2015 and 2018. Highway drainage will also be improved in various parts of the county – which will in turn make road surfaces more resilient to poor weather. Road edges will be strengthened where necessary. The Council will also use the money to install Sustainable Urban Drainage (SUDs) systems that allow water to drain away from roads more quickly. The council will now further develop a programme of work in line with its recently reviewed Highways Asset Management Plan.

**VAST MAJORITY GET FIRST-PREFERENCE SECONDARY SCHOOL**

About 91% of Oxfordshire children due to start secondary school this year have been allocated a place at their first-preference school. The council's Cabinet Member for Children, Education and Families Melinda Tilley said: *The county council has consistently had a strong record of ensuring a high percentage of children can attend their first-preference secondary school. Despite an increase in the number of applications received for September 2015, it's once again good news for the vast majority of families.*

**MINERALS & WASTE PLAN**

Current planning policy for minerals and waste is contained in the saved policies of the Minerals and Waste Local Plan dating from 1996. This is being replaced by a new Minerals and Waste Local Plan which was approved by the County Council on 24<sup>th</sup> March. The new plan proposes that extraction will rise from 0.715 million tonnes a year to 1.015 million tonnes a year, until 2031. It will now go before an examination in public before it can be adopted.

**CONSULTATION ON SIXTH FORM TRANSPORT**

The County Council is consulting on its proposed annual transport policy statement covering young people of sixth form age. The policy statement details the transport provision and financial assistance with transport that the council believes are necessary for Oxfordshire residents of sixth form age who are receiving education or training.

A key priority of the Government is to close the gap in attainment between those from poorer and more affluent backgrounds, and to ensure every young person participates in and benefits from a place in 16-19 education and training. The Government provides funding to tackle disadvantage both through the Education Funding Agency's (EFA) funding formula and through the £180 million 16-19 Bursary Fund to help young people meet the costs of participating in education and training post-16. 2015/16 will be the fifth year of the 16-19 Bursary Fund.

JOP and SH asked about a possible highways issue. Several large concrete balls have been placed on the verge outside The Old Rectory, Rotherfield Greys. DB confirmed this would be a highways issue and JOP to provide details to the highways agency.

**Report from Cllr David Nimmo-Smith SODC District Councillor**

DNS introduced himself to the new councillors and outlined his role as Oxfordshire County Council Cabinet for the Environment, South Oxfordshire District Councillor and Henley Town Councillor. The 10 parishes he will share with Charles Bailey.

Terry Dudeney asked about an enforcement issue with '3 Oaks' regarding an occupied caravan.

JOP read out an email from Ian Severn, the enforcement officer to give the current situation. Please see below:

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“I have conducted a site visit and spoke with the manager for the orchard. It would appear that a breach of planning control has occurred in relation to the caravans. We have advised the manager of the breach of planning control and are in the process of working with them to resolve the breach.”

Greys Green golf course had a planning application (P14/S0844/FUL) for the works now being undertaken. A planning inspector was requested to check the application was being adhered to.

**816/15 Public footpath/bridleway report**

Jane Warren (Chiltern Society Representative) provided the following report:

**ROTHERFIELD GREYS FOOTPATHS, MAY 2015**

All paths have been walked during the last month and are all passable.

However, there are issues with the correct line and waymarking of a group of paths (identified officially as Rotherfield Greys paths 25, 26, & 27) exiting Lambridge Wood south and east, which needs to be looked into. It is likely that the County Footpaths Officer will need to be involved to check the correct line of these paths but I will keep the Parish Clerk updated about any site visits planned.

Planning application P15/S1202/HH Satwell Close, Rotherfield Greys RG9 4QT was discussed and the parish council's decision was 'NO STRONG VIEWS'. A neighbour had emailed concerns over the size of the extensions, in view of privacy and light. This was taken into consideration.
