

Here is the latest update from Henley Neighbourhood Policing team.

Henley Sector comprises of Henley Town and the parishes of Goring, Woodcote, Goring Heath, South Stoke, Whitchurch-on-Thames, Nettlebed, Swyncombe, Pishill with Stonor, Bix & Assendon, Stoke Row, Highmoor, Checkendon, Rotherfield Greys, Sonning Common, Rotherfield Peppard, Kidmore End, Mapledurham, Harpsden, Binfield Heath, Shiplake, Eye & Dunsden.

### 'You said we did'/ Priorities

**Speeding** is of concern along Marlow Road, Henley and around the villages of Dunsden, Cookley Green, Shiplake and Assendon. This will be addressed during November by neighbourhood officers.

**Parking** around the Town Centre continues to be a problem and Fixed Penalty Notices are being issued for offences.

**Rural crime:** The neighbourhood teams for Henley and Thame will be on Rural Operations throughout November.

### Anti-social behaviour (ASB)

The PCSOs continue to patrol the Skate Park at Makin's Recreation Ground, in response to reports of low level ASB.

### Offenders brought to justice

- Offender charged for criminal damage against a Henley milkman, after a restraining order was breached.
- A male appeared in court following driving offences during which his vehicle mounted a pavement narrowly missing pedestrians; the male made off on foot and following a pursuit he was caught and charged by officers.

### Bonfire safety advice

Buckinghamshire Fire and Rescue Service offer the following advice about bonfire safety:

- Site well away from houses, garages, sheds, fences, overhead cables, trees and shrubs and always away from fireworks.
- Build the stack so that it is stable and will not collapse outwards or to one side.
- Never use flammable liquids - paraffin or petrol - to light the fire.
- Don't burn foam-filled furniture, aerosols, and tins of paint or bottles.
- Keep everyone away from the fire - especially children, who must be supervised all the time.
- For an emergency, keep buckets of water or the garden hose or a fire extinguisher ready.
- Pour water on the embers before leaving.

- PC Barb Taylor participated in a well-attended Recruitment Evening at Chiltern Edge School, Sonning Common.
