Here is the latest update from the Henley Neighbourhood Policing team.

Henley Sector comprises of Henley Town and the parishes of Goring, Woodcote, Goring Heath, South Stoke, Whitchurch-on-Thames, Nettlebed, Swyncombe, Pishill with Stonor, Bix & Assendon, Stoke Row, Highmoor, Checkendon, Rotherfield Greys, Sonning Common, Rotherfield Peppard, Kidmore End, Mapledurham, Harpsden, Binfield Heath, Shiplake, Eye & Dunsden.

## **Priorities**

Reassure Communities through a police presence both physically and virtually. We have increased our use of social media to promote our attendance at community events and to keep the public informed. The team continue to patrol the town centre and rural areas to deter and disrupt criminal activity.

#### Crime

Friday 19<sup>th</sup> Oct at 1250hrs, a male in his 50's threatened staff with a kitchen knife at McColls Goring High Street, leaving with approximately £400 and a quantity of cigarettes. Following an investigation by Thames Valley Police a man has been charged with one count of robbery and one count of possession of a bladed article. Gary Vass, aged 47, of Reading Road, Streatley was arrested on the same day and charged on the Saturday. Vass has been remanded in custody to appear at Oxford Magistrates Court on Monday (22/10).

Three male youths from the Reading area, were asked to attend Henley Police Station with their parents; words of advice given regarding their behaviour and the resulting criminal damage to the Water Mill at Mapledurham. Apology letters are also to be written and delivered to the owners of the Mapledurham Estate.

#### **Rural crime**

Op Migrate is in full swing. Our aim is to support the rural community with visible patrols and to detect, deter and disrupt all types of rural crime.

#### **Crime Reduction**

The Henley neighbourhood team, along with officers from OCC and Trading Standards were part of a week-long operation in the south and vale area; our aim to deter rogue traders. A team of two males from the South-West were spotted jet-washing the roof of a bungalow in Sonning Common, following an hour long stop-check and questioning they were asked to leave the area. The two males are being investigated for possible fraud, rogue trading and motoring offences.

During the operation many legitimate businesses were stop-checked for the correct paperwork and where appropriate, words of advice given.

The Henley neighbourhood team mounted a day-long under-cover operation on Saturday 27/10; concentrated around the town centre with the aim of combating the recent spate of purse and wallet thefts in Henley town centre.
