Warm Spaces

Residents in need of a warm place this winter are welcome to pop into the local leisure centre. All leisure centres across South Oxfordshire are opening up as Warm Spaces again this year. You can charge your phone, work on your computer, have a warm drink and a chat at Henley Leisure Centre, Abbey Sports Centre, Didcot Wave, Parks Sports Centre and Thame Leisure Centre. The Warm Spaces scheme runs from 9am-2pm on weekdays in the café and communal areas of the centres.

Emergency Housing

In times of freezing weather, the Council activates its emergency housing protocols to ensure everyone is brought inside out of the cold.

If you are aware of anyone who is rough sleeping, please contact us or the Housing Team who can arrange emergency accommodation immediately.

Please know, that our Council was among the first in the country to adopt the Housing First strategy. This means that we prioritise giving people who are homeless or about to become homeless, a permanent home. From there, all support services flow. Housing First is cost-effective and enables people to get their lives back on track much faster.
